RECENT CASES (SECOND CHAIR)

- *Delia Booker v. Richard Cross* (Dallas County, Texas). Obtained complete unanimous defense verdict at trial. Plaintiff alleged approximately \$32,000 in past medical expenses as the result of a minor impact, rear-end collision. Jury returned their verdict in approximately 15 minutes.
- *Blanca Saravia v. Isobel Cuppan* (Dallas County, Texas). Obtained defense verdict at trial. Plaintiff alleged that Defendant driver crossed the center line and collided with the front end of Plaintiff's vehicle, resulting in approximately \$40,000 in past and future medical expenses. Defendant contended that Plaintiff turned her vehicle in front of the Defendant's vehicle. Jury found Plaintiff 100 percent at fault for accident.
